## Re: Review of Regulated Retail Electricity Tariffs and Prices

Dear Mr Henry

Thank-you for the opportunity to comment on the QCA Issues Paper published in June 2011 regarding the Review of Regulated Retail Electricity Tariffs and Prices. COTA Queensland advocates on behalf of older people, particularly those who are financially disadvantaged or at risk of social or cultural isolation. We are interested in being part of any QCA consultation process regarding electricity tariffs and prices between now and March 2012.

The complexity of electricity pricing means that it is imperative that seniors are given every opportunity to understand the implications of likely changes to their bills, household energy use, or decisions which they may be required to make about their choice of electricity retailer.

We would certainly be concerned if fixed network costs were to adversely affect the total household electricity bill of seniors on fixed low incomes or in rental accommodation. Research from COTA New South Wales indicates that seniors are at risk of 'fuel poverty' when they are required to spend more than 4% of their income on all household energy sources in order to achieve a satisfactory indoor heating or cooling regime.
